On Friday, February 2, Barclay McCort and I went as Volunteer Deputy Voter Registrars to Salado High School. We registered students to vote during the lunch period. We registered four and all of the students saw us and knew we were there to register voters. We also had some adult staff who had questions about being registered to vote. SARW registers students at the Salado High School in Fall, and again in Spring, 30 days before election day for students who are at least 17 years, 10 months. We offered those who came to the table copies of the Constitution as well as Texas bookmarks. We shared looking at a sample ballot online and how to find information on Early Voting Polling locations.

SARW participated in the recent Valentines for Veterans as part of the VA National Salute to Veterans. This year, the National Salute to Veterans was held February 12-16 across the nation. SARW made donations estimated at \$163.00. We will take up another donation in a few months. When donating, please include the estimated value of the items. (Keep in mind that there are female veterans who are in need as well as male veterans.)

Legislative – Deborah Roberson

In the wake of the Florida school shooting that killed fourteen students and three school staff members, we can expect debates on how to prevent something like this from happening again in our public places. It is a realistic expectation for citizens to be able to attend public venues and be safe. It is evident something must change but the debate over future legislation, both on the federal and state level, is 'WHAT exactly must change and HOW it will change.' It is a complicated legislative issue with passionate opinions and convictions.

According to the February 20, 2018 Austin Statesman, Gov. Abbott focused on three major points regarding mass shootings that need to be addressed in Texas:

- 1. Ensure that Texas schools are safe
- 2. Rectify the federal background check database
- 3. Address mental health as a cause of some shootings

When asked if changing the gun laws in the U.S. should be considered, Gov. Abbott did not mention it as a solution. He stated that "There were red flags before the mass shooting at Sutherland Springs, before the shooting in Florida and yet those weren't responded to," making reference to missing data in the FBI's National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS).

At the federal level: last November, Senator Chris Murphy (D - CN) and Sen. John Cornyn (R - TX) produced the Murphy-Cornyn Bill that would hold accountable federal and state officials if they fail to enter relevant records into the FBI system.

Representative Culberson (R – TX) introduced a similar bill, HB 4477, in the House on November 29, 2017. It is entitled "Fix NICS Act of 2017," and the purpose is to get federal and state officials to enter data into the NICS system to improve the odds of avoiding tragedies such as the latest school shooting.
