#### LEGISLATIVE UPDATE - Deborah Roberson

86<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislative Session (2019)

The 86<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislative session begins on January 8, 2019 and is in session for 140 days until May 27, 2019. There are 181 members of the Texas House and Senate that can file bills in this session until March 8<sup>th</sup>. To date there have been 619 prefiled bills according to Legislative Scan (https://legiscan.com/TX). This website will help you track various bills as they proceed through the legislative process. It is also a good source to summarize each bill including the bill's sponsors. The website further breaks down the filed bills into categories such as:

- ➤ Top Texas Sponsors (House and Senate)
- ➤ Top Texas Committees
- ➤ Most Viewed Texas Bills
- ➤ Most Monitored Texas Bills

Here's a sampling of some interesting bills that have been filed for the 86<sup>th</sup> Legislative session:

- > Senate Bill 66: Sen. Jane Nelson (R) would reduce and eventually eliminate the state's franchise tax
- ➤ House Bill 49: Rep. Lyle Larson (R) would get rid of daylight-saving time in Texas
- ➤ House Joint Resolution 24 would propose a constitutional amendment requiring the state to fund at least half of the cost of funding public schools (If voters approved the amendment, local property tax collections would not apply to the state's share.) https://smcorridornews.com/bill-filing-begins-for-upcoming-86th-texas-legislative-session/
- ➤ House Bill 222: Rep. Matt Krause (R) would prevent cities from requiring employers to provide paid sick leave to employees
- > Senate Bill 95: Sen. Jose Menendez (D) proposes giving every Texas teacher a \$4,000 pay raise
- ➤ House Bill 21: Rep. Terry Canales (D) would exempt college textbooks from sales taxes during one week in August and one week in January

The Texas 86<sup>th</sup> Legislative Session promises to be a "lively" session and SARW will monitor various bills of importance to Bell County.
