LEGISLATIVE UPDATE – Deborah Roberson

86th Texas Legislative Session (2019) – Part 2

The 86th Texas Legislative session begins on January 8, 2019 and is in session for 140 days until May 27, 2019. There are 181 members of the Texas House and Senate that can file bills in this session until March 8th. To date there have been **893** prefiled bills according to Legislative Scan (<https://legiscan.com/TX>). This website will help you track various bills as they proceed through the legislative process. It is also a good source to summarize each bill including the bill's sponsors.

In the 85th Legislative regular session (2017), there were 10,672 bills introduced with 4,734 of those bills completed (completed refers to either the bills passed being signed or vetoed by Governor Abbott). In the 2017 Special Session called by Governor Abbott, there were 1,247 bills introduced with 668 of those bills being completed. (<https://legiscan.com/TX>).

One of the 2017 Special Session bills signed by Governor Abbott was HB 21 which created a School Finance Commission to study and make recommendations to address reforming the Texas school finance system (<https://gov.texas.gov/news/post/governor-abbott-signs-school-finance-reform-legislation>)

On December 19, 2018, Governor Abbott released this statement regarding the School Finance Commission Report:

“This session, we have an opportunity to solve one of Texas’ most pressing challenges by reforming our broken school finance system and developing a model that creates a brighter and more promising future for our children. Texans expect and deserve for their leaders to solve this critical issue. Today’s school finance commission report made clear that the state must reform the broken Robin Hood system and allocate more state funding to education. This session, we will do just that.” (<https://gov.texas.gov/news/post/governor-abbott-statement-on-school-finance-commission-report>)

The Texas 86th Legislative Session promises to be a “lively” session and SARW will monitor various bills of importance to Bell County as well as the state of Texas.
