LEGISLATIVE UPDATE – Provided by Associate Member, David Swarthout

The Texas Legislature is considering a number of proposals related to property taxes and school finance.

Among these proposals are reforming the property tax system, as well as changing the franchise tax and how the state captures online sales tax revenues.

Property tax measures being considered in 2019 include replacing the property tax, capping property tax revenue growth, amending rollback election policies for local rate increases, and expanding transparency requirements for proposed tax increases.

Legislators are also looking at reducing or eliminating local property taxes that fund the maintenance and operation of public schools. To make up for the lost revenue, they are considering ending certain tax exemptions, increasing the sales tax on certain items, or expanding the base of the sales tax to include certain business services, such as accounting or legal services. In addition, there is a possibility that they may establish a growth cap of 2.5% on the amount of property tax revenue a local taxing unit may collect in a year.

Current law allows voters to petition a taxing unit that increases tax rates by 8 percent in a year to trigger a rollback election. Lawmakers may consider decreasing the rollback rate or requiring an increase in a tax rate that exceeds the rollback rate to automatically trigger an election without petition. Proposals also may decrease the number of signatures needed for a successful petition of a rollback election or require rollback elections to be held during general elections in November.
