
LEGISLATIVE UPDATE – Jessica Menking Diem

Following the end of a successful 86th Legislative session, there are a **myriad of new laws taking effect September 1st!** Here are a few highlights among the hundreds of new laws coming:

- HB 3:** Transformational school finance reform means that school districts are getting a larger daily allotment for students, money for faculty and staff pay increases, and more money for specialized programs to better serve Texas students, as well as over \$5 billion in statewide property tax relief.
- SB 21:** Age to use and/or purchase tobacco products is now 21 (includes cigarettes, e-cigarettes, and other tobacco products; waiver for active duty military).
- HB 234-** Lemonade Freedom- children are, by state law, allowed to sell lemonade and other non-alcoholic drinks on private property (no permits or HOA permission required).
- HB 1545-** Beer to go- similar to wineries, breweries in Texas are now permitted to sell you beer directly.
- HB 1992-** No more "spoofing"- telemarketers can be fined up to \$1,000 per call for putting false information on caller ID.
- HB 370-** As of September 1, it is a felony to steal mail in Texas (harsher penalties for the porch package thieves!) While it has always been a felony under federal law, it has only been a misdemeanor under Texas law.
- HB 1631-** Bans the use of red-light cameras statewide
- HB 547-** You can now show a digital copy of your hunting/fishing license, rather than being required to show a paper copy.
