CHAPLAIN'S COLUMN - Bobi Anderson

The Season Has a Reason

Isaiah 9:6-7 For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end, on the throne of David and over his kingdom, to establish it and to uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time forth and forevermore. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will do this.

This prophecy of the coming of the Christ Child was written over a millennium before Jesus arrived in the stable in Bethlehem. Statistics tells us that the likelihood of 1 person fulfilling 8 OT prophecies is 1 to the 17th power. To fulfill 48, odds jump to 10 to the 157th power. And when you consider there are 300-400 OT prophecies concerning the Messiah, one must surely realize that there was universal plan behind His advent.

But more miraculous than that, is the proof from Isaiah that God's plan goes into the eternal future. Jesus Christ is not a Christmas miracle, He is an eternal miracle. The promise that He will not only establish His own government, but it will be just and right forever. We live in the Age of Grace: the age of salvation the God promised through Isaiah and through Jesus Christ.

"Christ-mas" is a contraction of the term "Christ's mass," did not come into use until the Middle Ages. No evidence remains about the exact date of the birth of Christ. The December 25 date was chosen because various festivals were held in conjunction with the winter solstice. The Feast of the Unconquerable Sun celebrated the beginning of the return of the sun. When Christianity became the religion of the Empire, the church either had to suppress the festivals or transform them and the winter solstice seemed the best one, and the festival of the sun became a celebration of the Son, the Light of the world (John 9:5).

Celebrate this season with the reason in mind: the salvation Jesus brought to earth that long-ago night in Bethlehem. Celebrate it and share it! Blessings!




LEGISLATIVE UPDATE – Jessica Menking Diem
