#### FROM THE DESK OF STATE REPRESENTATIVE BRAD BUCKLEY

The 87th Texas Legislature continues to move forward to serve Texans in a manner that respects transparency and provides for citizens to engage lawmakers while protecting the health of all involved. The Capitol is open and we welcome your participation. We ask that you kindly call our office to arrange a visit or we can meet remotely if you prefer. Recently, Speaker of the Texas House, Dade Phelan, announced committee assignments for this session. I am honored to serve as Vice-Chair of the Defense and Veterans Affairs Committee and serve as a member of the Public Education and the Local and Consent Calendars Committees. These appointments will allow me to participate in a meaningful way on issues important to House District 54 and Texas. All committee hearings will be broadcast online, archived, and can be found at <a href="https://www.house.texas.gov/video-audio">www.house.texas.gov/video-audio</a>.

Winter Storm Uri stopped us in our tracks in February. Amidst insecurity about power, water, and infrastructure, Texans banded together to support and care for one another in incredible ways. It is a priority for me to be your voice in Austin to ensure that measures are put into place that will protect our energy sources and our electric grid from peril.

In the coming weeks, I will continue to file, analyze, and co-author legislation. I have already filed legislation to support our veterans, improve job opportunities for military spouses, and improve internet service in rural and underserved areas. I will file bills or co-author bills over the next few weeks that will protect minors from registered sex offenders, lower health insurance costs for self-employed Texans, reform commercial property value appraisals and several other important issues. I have co-authored pro-life and pro-Second Amendment legislation and will continue to work with my Republican colleagues on legislation to support RPT priorities.

Governor Greg Abbott highlighted several emergency items in his State of the State address, which allows the legislature to work on specific issues prior to the constitutional threshold. Those items include broadband access across Texas, bail reform, election integrity, police funding, COVID-19 liability protections for businesses, and most recently, ERCOT reform. I am looking forward to digging into these issues and solving problems for Texas.

On a Federal level, you can go to Congress.gov and follow Legislation. For example, Rep. Sheila Jackson Lee, has introduced H.R. 127, and she wants to severely restrict our gun rights. Please look up this piece of legislation and send emails to your representatives to object to this restrictive bill.

No matter what you do, all of this counts towards your volunteer hours for our organization. As we get back out into the world our volunteer hours will start to accumulate again.

The 87<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature is in session as of January 12, 2021. During the first 30 days of session, Committees are announced and organized and during days 30-60 of the legislative session only emergency items can be heard. There are numerous proposed bills that have been filed in both the House and the Senate. One of the proposed bills which SARW is concerned about and following is Election Integrity. Governor Abbott has placed Election Integrity as one of the emergency items to be heard. Representative Briscoe Cain is the Chairman for the Election Integrity Committee.

Each Friday there is a Fight for Election Integrity zoom meeting that occurs. Our last meeting involved Representative Cain who provided an informative update on the legislatures efforts to improve our election laws so that Texas elections are uniform across the state.
