LEGISLATIVE UPDATE – Michele Hercules

A BEAUTIFUL GOP SWEEP...THANK YOU, THANK YOU, THANK YOU, Members & Candidates!

Texas House Speaker - State Rep. Tony Tinderholt announces he's running for speaker. Tinderholt announced his challenge to incumbent House Speaker Dade Phelan last week, saying his concerns with Phelan stem from a lack of movement on the Republican Party's legislative priorities. Notably, Tinderholt wants to end the practice of Republicans giving leadership positions to Democrats.

"Texans have voted to put Republicans in power because they want Republicans to control government and Republican policy to become law." – State Rep. Bryan Slayton

Texas property taxes are among the highest in the nation, with the majority levied in the name of the school district's "maintenance and operations." This fall, Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar revealed that there was a state surplus of <u>\$27 billion</u>. During the gubernatorial debate this October, Gov. Abbott explained that he <u>plans</u> to use that excess revenue to "eliminate school property taxes" so Texans can "genuinely own their own home without being taxed out of it."

In support of Abbott's plan, a <u>bill</u> that would put 90 percent of the \$27 billion surplus towards "buying down" the school portion of property taxes was filed. HB 629, by State Rep. Ellen Troxclair (R- Hill Country)

Would put 90 percent of the state's \$27 billion budget surplus toward reducing the property tax burden.

Would allow us to cut property taxes in half, while fully funding public schools and reducing our reliance on Robin Hood. "Robin Hood" is the nickname for the state's school funding scheme that sees property tax dollars collected locally but then diverted to other school districts with very little oversight or accountability.

Similar legislation was filed by Reps. Tom Oliverson (R-Cypress) and Matt Shaheen (R-Plano). Texans for Fiscal Responsibility designated the measures as the "strongest two bills filed" thus far to deal with the state's property tax burden.

In 2020, more than 94 percent of Republican voters supported a non-binding proposition on the GOP primary ballot banning taxpayer-funded lobbying.

SB 175, by State Sen. Mayes Middleton (R-Wallisville)

Would prohibit public funds from being used to hire registered lobbyists.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE (CONTINUED)

"Every step of the way, taxpayer-funded lobbyists have lobbied against key conservative priorities including property tax relief, election integrity, disclosures of what bonds truly cost taxpayers, the constitutional ban on a state income tax, and they even opposed the bill to fund and protect the teacher retirement pension system." – Mayes Middleton

Two lawmakers have filed measures to ban child gender mutilation procedures in Texas.

HB 41, by State Rep. Steve Toth (R-The Woodlands)

Would prohibit healthcare providers from receiving professional liability insurance coverage for performing or prescribing certain "gender transitioning" procedures for children, including genital removal surgeries, chemical castration, puberty blockers, and other sex-change therapies. HB 42, by State Rep. Bryan Slaton (R-Royse City)

Would designate genital removal surgeries, chemical castration, puberty blockers, and other sexchange therapies as child abuse.

"This child gender modification is child abuse, plain and simple. It is finally time that the Texas House, like the Senate, step up and defend innocent children from these bogus medical practices." – Bryan Slaton

Texas has a growing trend of drag shows welcoming children to what are often sexually explicit events. Fajita Kings in Temple, TX hosted the "Golden Girls Trivia and Drag Show" in November.

HB 643, by State Rep. Jared Patterson (R-Frisco)

Would designate drag shows as sexually oriented and require businesses that host them to be classified as such.

No Federal Funding for Teachers' Union Act

U.S. Rep. Ronny Jackson (R-Amarillo)

Would prohibit the federal government from giving financial support to these entities. Teachers' unions would lose access to federal dollars.

"Corrupt teachers' unions sold out our kids when they lined Democrat politicians' pockets with campaign contributions to keep students out of the classroom, and later to force masking, despite clear evidence that these decisions were harmful to kids' educational and developmental growth." "Just when we thought corrupt teachers' unions could not get worse, they pressed the Biden Administration to investigate parents who voice disagreement with their decisions as domestic terrorists." "It's time we restore parents' voices, prohibit corrupt teachers' unions from using your tax dollars to advance their radical agenda, and send them a clear message: LEAVE OUR KIDS ALONE!" – Ronny Jackson
