For those of you that have been following the Special Sessions of the 88th Legislative Session, you've been busy all summer long.

Our Legislators have been working on tax cuts, the impeachment of Attorney General Ken Paxton and they will have an additional session that will address education funding, teacher pay raises and the creation of educational savings accounts – for school choice. I have been told that we could very well go into October. We will keep you posted!

On the home front, we have been working on donating good books to school libraries. LEGISLATIVE UPDATE – Michele Hercules

September brings the impeachment trial of Attorney General Paxton. Texans overwhelmingly voted him into office. He has fought, not only for our State but for our entire Country, combatting Biden's unconstitutional attacks on our freedoms and security. This politically motivated impeachment, if successful, endangers all other elected officers who are out of favor with House leadership. Impeachments, which used to be rare, are used to target officials now. When an elected official commits a crime, it is preferable that they be prosecuted in a criminal court and not impeachment by a legislative body.

Texans for Lawsuit Reform, the big donor Houston-based political group, has spent millions of dollars unsuccessfully seeking to defeat Paxton politically. Now they are telling senators to oppose motions to dismiss impeachment charges. The top three Senate recipients from Texans for Lawsuit Reform include Pete Flores (\$1.2 million), Joan Huffman (\$420,538), and Drew Springer (\$400,137).

Expect a 3rd Special Session in October! Topic...most likely, School Choice, Education Freedom, Money Follow the Child...whichever you'd like to call it. Just be mindful, that oftentimes, the title of a bill can be quite different than its content. Consider SB8 from the 88th Regular session. It passed the Senate and came close in the House, and Lt. Gov. Patrick refers to it as a "universal school choice". But it's far from universal. It limits participation to only students who have been enrolled in public school already and attended public school at least 90% of the previous school year.

The Republic Party of Texas voted for "Parental Rights and Educational Freedom" as a Legislative Priority.

Parents are the primary decision-makers for their children in all matters. This authority shall be protected as an inalienable right. This shall include the choice of schooling where the money follows the child without strings attached, and enforcement and penalty mechanisms when parents' rights are violated. The right to education shall be free from any social theories.

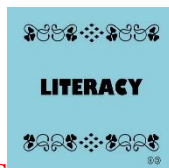
LEGISLATION (CONTINUED)

In the News...Texas State Troopers Abandoned Children Rescue

Over the last several days, troopers with the Texas Department of Public Safety have rescued four abandoned children along the Texas-Mexico Border. The children were immediately turned over to the U.S. Border Patrol since Texas cannot process illegal alien children. Meanwhile, the Biden administration has reportedly lost track of 85,000 illegal alien children inside the country. Reports from Axios and Reuters indicate that the Biden administration has lost track of nearly 40 percent of unaccompanied minors released to sponsors, including dozens in Houston.

Praying for this injustice to end and for the protection of our men and women serving at the border. I can't imagine what they endure both physically and spiritually.
