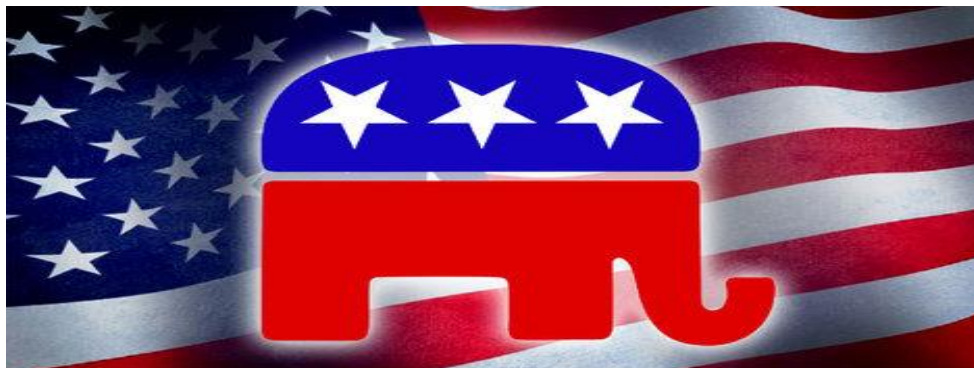

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE – Michele Hercules

The temperatures outside are beginning to drop but inside the Capitol and around the Great State of Texas... grassroots fires are igniting. Calls for the resignation of Speaker of the House, Speaker Dade Phelan, have gotten louder after the Senate's acquittal of Attorney General Paxton.

For Dade Phelan to cry foul and question the integrity of the Senate jurors and of my office when his rushed, no-facts, no-record process failed to achieve the results he wanted is disgusting and proves he is unworthy of his leadership position. -Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick

Lt. Governor Dan Patrick has also called for a full audit of the House's impeachment cost.

In a 58-2 vote, the Republican Party of Texas overwhelmingly passed a resolution calling for the Speaker's removal. <https://texasgop.org/phelan-resign/>

Expect a 3rd Special Session in October! Topic...most likely, School Choice, Education Freedom, Money Follow the Child...whichever you'd like to call it. Just be mindful, that oftentimes, the title of a bill can be quite different than its content. Consider SB8 from the 88th Regular session. It passed the Senate and came close in the House, and Lt. Gov. Patrick refers to it as a "universal school choice". But it's far from universal. It limits participation to only students who have been enrolled in public school already and attended public school at least 90% of the previous school year.

The Republic Party of Texas voted for "Parental Rights and Educational Freedom" as a Legislative Priority. Governor Abbott has warned lawmakers that he is dedicated to passing school choice legislation.

Parents are the primary decision-makers for their children in all matters. This authority shall be protected as an inalienable right. This shall include the choice of schooling where the money

follows the child without strings attached, and enforcement and penalty mechanisms when parents' rights are violated. The right to education shall be free from any social theories.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE (CONTINUED)

Representatives continue to urge Governor Abbott to call an immediate special session to address the invasion on the southern border.

On September 20th, the Biden Administration cut the razor wire Texas set up on parts of the border, on the same day Gov. Abbott officially declared an "invasion". Despite all of Texas' efforts thus far, thousands of illegals per day enter Texas.

A very BIG victory for Texas came through our Texas Supreme Court, allowing SB 14, (Law Protecting Children from Harmful Gender Transitions) to go into effect!

Fourteen Constitutional Amendments will be on our ballots on Nov. 7th in Texas. As they typically are, the language and wording will be written to confuse the voter. SARW will ensure that our voters are fully educated on each amendment as we draw closer to the election. Very important decisions will be made.

The November elections will offer 14 Propositions to vote on yes or no. These are actual changes to our Texas Constitution. The saladovillagevoice.com has had full-page articles explaining these propositions for the past two weeks. Information is also available at sos.texas.gov. Also, on the ballot in November is a Salado ISD bond proposal. The proposal has two parts, A and B, to vote on. Our newspaper has had articles, and public discussions sessions are promised. Educate yourself so when you enter the voting booth you will be ready. This is the future of our community. Thanks again for all you do to promote Republican values.
