LEGISLATIVE UPDATE – Michele Hercules

On October 9th at 1:00 pm, our third Special Session began. Governor Greg Abbott called on lawmakers to deliver school choice for every family, protect Texans and Americans against Biden’s border crisis, and ban all COVID-19 vaccine mandates.

On November 7th the session ended, however, lawmakers failed to pass priority bills on education savings accounts and immigration.

A fourth session was immediately called for the first time in twenty years and the tenth time in Texas’ history.

The cost of each full thirty-day special session to taxpayers is 1.2 million dollars in per diem payments.

Other November 7th news... Fourteen constitutional amendments were on the ballot this November 7th. All but one, Proposition 13, which would have allowed judges to retire at a later age, was rejected.

Good news...! On November 14th, Governor Greg Abbott signed SB7 into law effective February 6, 2024.

SB7 – Prohibits a private employer from adopting or enforcing certain COVID-19 vaccine mandates, authorizing an administrative penalty.

Almost there...!

SB4 - Creates new state crime for entering Texas illegally and authorizes Texas law enforcement to arrest and prosecute all people who cross the border illegally anywhere in Texas.

After attempts by Democrat amendments to weaken the bill failed, SB4 passed the House and will now move to the governor’s desk.

[SB3](#) – Provides additional funding for the maintenance, operation, and construction of border barrier infrastructure as well as for the Texas Dept. of Public Safety to use for policing the Colony Ridge development outside of Houston.

The House approved SB3 and the bill is expected to reach Governor Abbott's desk to be signed.

Lawmakers now have until December 6th to take up the Governor's final legislative priority and pass legislation on school choice and education funding.

The Texas Constitution does not limit the number of special sessions a governor may call in between two regular legislative sessions. Will there be a fifth? We shall see...

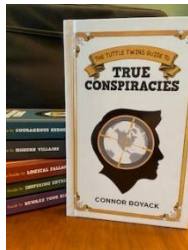

LITERACY – Nancy Norris

Many of you are already familiar with *The Tuttle Twins* books written by Connor Boyack. There are several available for different ages from toddlers to adults. They specifically teach the value of freedom and personal responsibility. The first books included such topics as Limited Government, Free Markets, Property Rights and Entrepreneurship. Newer ones are on American History and the Bill of Rights. There are six books recently available entitled *Courageous Heroes*, *Modern Villains*, *Logical Fallacies*, *Inspiring Entrepreneurs*, *Beware Your Bias* and *True Conspiracies*. These books really seem to write about their subjects in a concise and fact-filled way.

The information on *The Tuttle Twins* website about the stories listed in the book *True Conspiracies*, the last book written in this series, describe them as “stark reminders of the ability of powerful people to shape world events and our own lives through deception and lawless corruption.” Just a few of the *True Conspiracy* chapters included in the book are Gulf of Tonkin, The Tuskegee Experiment, Sugar/Fat Studies, Social Media Manipulation and Hunter Biden’s Laptop. Each individual story is divided into sections entitled “Things Aren’t Always What They Seem, Cui Bono (Who benefits), Why Does This Matter and What We Learned. Also included at the end of each story is a short report of either someone’s testimony, a congressional report, a declassified top-secret memorandum, or a review of the evidence, or, on the chapter about Hunter Biden’s laptop, an email from former CIA Acting Director Mike Morell and a CIA colleague, Marc Polymeropoulos to fellow intelligence community officials. This email was eventually signed by fifty-one former intelligence officials and four other former CIA directors. This story alone demonstrates how our intelligence agencies can influence public opinion and control information (or disinformation) to the general public.
