



NEVER FORGET

Wednesday night before the NFRW Legislative Day, members of the NFRW Board of Directors were invited to the Israeli Embassy in Washington, D.C. We were invited to screen raw footage from the October 7th Hamas attacks in Israel and to be briefed on the current situation. Most importantly, we were asked to be a witness and tell the story. Just as the world said, "Never Again," and "Never Forget," after the Holocaust, we must be the voice of our Jewish brothers and sisters as it is happening AGAIN.

I knew this would be heart-wrenching and very hard to watch. In my role as a Board Member of the Texas State School Safety Board, I have sat through some pretty awful and hard discussions. I knew this would be the same. Just as I believed it is my duty to sit through those hard school safety discussions to keep our school children in Texas safe, I felt it was my duty to be the witness to the atrocities of October 7, 2023. If my grandfather, as a 19-year-old sheep herder from New Mexico, could liberate the concentration camps of World War II, I could sit through 45 minutes of footage.

When we pulled up, demonstrators were outside with their bullhorns screaming at the Embassy and us. They had sirens and noisemakers on high volume that faced the Embassy, blaring 24 hours a day. It is interesting to note that these protestors were white, American, college-aged people. I am not sure they have ever even been to Israel. They had their ear protection on from the sirens, bull horns in one hand and their Starbucks in another. Yes, that's right, you read that correctly, they had Starbucks in their hands. Do they know the privilege of getting a Starbucks or even food in this region? In the Embassy, the noise was deafening even with all doors and windows shut and at least 50 yards away from them. It is their right, and my grandfather helped guarantee that right. But I wondered, do they know their freedom of speech does not exist in most Muslim countries?

We could not bring any recording devices, including our phones, and were asked to sign an agreement that we would not distribute any photos or images seen that evening. The Israeli



government is very careful about who screens and sees these images to protect the victims and their families, many of whom have not seen this footage of their loved ones. However, we were asked to tell the story.

The next few sentences are hard to read but please read them because we must be a witness and tell the world. The footage was taken from body cameras and cell phones of the Hamas terrorists and some closed-circuit cameras in homes. The terrorists kicked in doors of homes and shot families hiding under tables, threw grenades into safe rooms and cars, pulled passengers from cars to shoot them, set houses on fire and surrounded houses shooting inside. Victims were burned alive in their homes or shot when they retreated outside. Parents were killed in front of their crying and terrified children. Terrorists boldly ate from their victim's refrigerators after killing the entire household.

They dragged people from their homes of all ages, tied their hands, then threw them like animals in the back of trucks to be taken away as hostages. They brutally violated and maimed both live and dead victims. Those actions are just too hard to write about. They shouted "Allahu Akbar" as they maimed and killed, high- fiving each other, laughing and cheering while killing and destroying. One terrorist called his family to say he had killed 10. His parents cried with pride and praised Allah.

When the footage was over, we sat with the lights low for several minutes, absorbing what we had just witnessed. I said a silent prayer and wiped away a few tears as I thought of two boys, my son's age, I had just seen. The images of children in their Mickey Mouse pajamas and teenagers at a music concert burned in my head. When the lights came up, members of hostage families came in with the posters of their loved ones. Hostages from the ages of 1 to 80 were represented. Some knew where their loved ones were, and some did not. One woman who spoke was taken hostage with her family. She was released after 50 days; she does not know where her family is. They asked us to tell their story, and in my heart, I promised I would.

The Embassy officials took questions and asked us to remember three things:

- 1. We stand with Israel.
- 2. Israel did not start this war.
- 3. The hostages still held must be released.

As our ladies descended onto Capitol Hill on Thursday, we were resolute in sharing this message with our lawmakers.



At the end of the Embassy meeting, before leaving the room, we stood together, held hands, and said the Lord's Prayer. When we went back outside to leave, the chanting and screaming by protestors was even louder. Being Republican Women and Americans, we broke out into "God Bless America" to drown them out!

Never Forget, that's what the world said. Israel is under assault by Hamas. It was the largest killing of Jews in one day since the Holocaust. Memory and education are vital. WE must never forget, never give up, and tell the story. They attacked on Saturday; their next attack will be on Sunday.

I stand in support and solidarity with our valued friend and ally, Israel, and our Jewish brothers and sisters. Please join me.
